Reduce Neighbourhood Crime

Burglary (Residential)

29.5% decrease in Burglary (Residential)
Baseline: 1,060 Vs 747 in the 12 months to March 2026.



Theft from the Person

22.1% increase in Theft from the Person
Baseline: 86 Vs 105 in the 12 months to March 2026.



Theft from a Vehicle

57.8% decrease in Theft from a Vehicle
Baseline: 562 Vs 237 in the 12 months to March 2026.



Robbery (Personal)

32.3% increase in Robbery (Personal)
Baseline: 62 Vs 82 in the 12 months to March 2026.

156.4% increase in Theft of a Vehicle
