Is-Ganghellor Prifysgol Cymru
Vice-Chancellor of the University of Wales*

Mae'r Athro Elwen Evans, CB, yn Is-Ganghellor Prifysgol Cymru, Prifysgol Cymru y Drindod Dewi Sant (PCDDS) a'r Grŵp PCDDS, strwythur dau sector sy'n cynnwys Coleg Sir Gâr a Choleg Ceredigion fel colegau cyfansoddol.

Astudiodd yr Athro Evans y Gyfraith yng Ngholeg Girton, Caergrawnt, gan raddio â gradd dosbarth cyntaf dwbl: M.A. (Cantab). Ar ôl graddio aeth ymlaen i Ysgol y Gyfraith Ysbytai'r Frawdlys ac fe'i galwyd i'r Bar gan Gray's Inn yn 1980. Fe'i penodwyd yn Gwnsler y Frenhines yn 2002.

Mae'r Athro Evans wedi mwynhau gyrrfa lwyddiannus iawn yn fargyfreithiwr, gan ddewis ymarfer yng Nghymru yn bennaf. Mae wedi ymgymryd ag amrywiaeth eang o waith cyfreithiol, ac wedi arbenigo mewn cyfraith trosedd ar lefelau treial ac apeliadau. Mae hi'n Gofiadur Llys y Goron ers cael ei phenodi yn 2001. Bu'n Pennaeth Iscoed Chambers am dros 15 mlynedd.

Yn 2015 fe'i penodwyd i'rôle Pennaeth Coleg y Gyfraith a Throseddeg ym Mhrifysgol Abertawe lle roedd yn gyfrifol am sefydlu Ysgol y Gyfraith Hillary Rodham Clinton. Yn 2020, fe'i penodwyd yn Ddirprwy Is-Ganghellor a Deon Gweithredol ar gyfer Cyfadran y Dyniaethau a'r Gwyddorau

Professor Elwen Evans, KC, is Vice-Chancellor of the University of Wales, the University of Wales Trinity Saint David (UWTSD) and the UWTSD Group, a dual sector structure comprising Coleg Sir Gâr and Coleg Ceredigion as constituent colleges.

Professor Evans read Law at Girton College, Cambridge, graduating with a double first: M.A. (Cantab). On graduating she attended the Inns of Court School of Law and was called to the Bar by Gray's Inn in 1980. She was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2002.

Professor Evans has enjoyed a very successful career as a barrister, choosing to practice mainly in Wales. She has undertaken a wide range of legal work, specialising in criminal law at trial and appellate levels. She sits as a Crown Court Recorder having been appointed in 2001. She was Head of Iscoed Chambers for over 15 years prior.

In 2015 she was appointed Head of the College of Law & Criminology at Swansea where she was responsible for establishing the Hillary Rodham Clinton School of Law. In 2020, she was appointed Pro-Vice-Chancellor and Executive Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and is credited with having led

Adeiladu Diwylliant o Blismona ar Sail Tystiolaeth
Building a Culture of Evidence Based Policing

Mae Dr Matt Bland yn Brif Swyddog Gweithredol Cymdeithas Plismona ar Sail Tystiolaeth y DU, ac yn Athro Cyswllt Plismona ar Sail Tystiolaeth ym Mhrifysgol Caergrawnt. Fe oedd Cadeirydd Annibynnol y Swyddfa Gartref ar gyfer Adolygiad Fformiwla Cyllido'r Heddlu ac ef yw'r Cyfarwyddwr Treial ar gyfer treial cenedlaethol y Weinyddiaeth Gyfiawnder o brofion polygraft ar gyfer troseddwyr trais domestig. Gweithiodd Matt i Heddluoedd Norfolk a Suffolk am 16 mlynedd ac mae wedi ysgrifennu tri llyfr a mwy na dwsin o erthyglau i gyfnodolion. Yn ei rôl gyfredol ei faes gorchwyl yw helpu ym wreiddio'r defnydd o dystiolaeth gorau mewn plismona yn y DU drwy hyrwyddo defnyddio a chynhyrchu ymchwil a chyfathrebu yn ei gylch.

Bydd Matt yn cyflwyno ar y modd y gall asiantaethau heddlu ddatblygu'r diwylliant o werthuso sydd ei angen er mwyn gweithredu ar sail tystiolaeth. Bydd ei sgwrs yn canolbwytio ar y cyfleoedd dyddiol, cost isel sy'n bodoli i heddluoedd, comisiynwyr heddlu a thro seddu a'u partneriaid. Bydd yn dadlau bod yr holl gynhwysion ar gyfer diwylliant o werthuso fwy na thebyg yn bodoli eisoes, ac yn dangos y modd y mae eu defnyddio o fudd i'r cyhoedd. Bydd ei sgwrs yn canolbwytio ar y camau ymarferol y gall bobl eu cymryd yn eu rolau eu hunain.

Dr Matt Bland is a Chief Operating Officer of the **UK Society of Evidence Based Policing**, and an Associate Professor of Evidence Based Policing at Cambridge University. He was the Home Office's Independent Chair of the Police Funding Formula Review and is Trial Director for the Ministry of Justice's national trial of polygraph tests for domestic abuse offenders. Matt worked for Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies for 16 years and has written three books as well as more than a dozen journal articles. In his current role his brief is to help embed the use of best evidence in policing in the UK by promoting the use, production and communication of research.

Matt will present on how police agencies can develop the culture of evaluation required to be evidence-informed. His talk will focus on the everyday, low-cost opportunities that exist for police forces, police crime commissioners and their partners. He will make a case that all the ingredients for a culture of evaluation probably already exist, and how the use of them is in the public interest. His talk will focus on practical steps that people can take in their own roles.

Jessica yw **Rheolwr Ardal Cymorth i Ddioddefwyr yng Nghymru**, lle mae'n goruchwyllo gwasanaethau dioddefwyr allweddol ledled Cymru, gan gynnwys pedwar cytundeb Aml-drosedd, cytundeb Troseddau Casineb Cymru Gyfan, cytundeb Ymddygiad Gwrthgymdeithasol, a chytundeb Stelcio Arbenigol. Gyda phrofiad helaeth mewn rheoli gwasanaethau cymorth, arweiniodd Jessica Ganolfan Cymorth Casineb Cymru a'r prosiect Pont Enfys yn flaenorol, a chymhwysodd fel Cynghorwr Annibynnol ar Drais Domestig, gan gefnogi goroeswyr Cam-drin Domestig LHDT+

Yn eiriolwr dros gynhwysiant a chyflawnder, mae Jessica hefyd wedi gwirfoddoli gyda Stonewall Cymru ar eu Gwasanaeth Gwybodaeth, a gwirfoddolodd gyda Heddlu De Cymru o fewn eu hadran Cymorth Corfforaethol. Yn ogystal, mae hi wedi cefnogi pobl ifainc a oedd yn gadael gofal fel Mentor penodedig.

Wedi ymrwymo i ddatblygu staff, mae gan Jessica gymhwyster ILM Lefel 5 mewn Hyfforddi a Mentora, ac mae'n hyfforddi aelodau tîm yn weithredol, gan feithrin twf o fewn y sefydliad. Enillodd ei gradd 2:1 mewn Troseddeg o Brifysgol Caerdydd, lle y cydweithiodd â Sefydliad y Brifysgol ar Wyddorau'r Heddlu ar ei thraethawd hir, a oedd yn canolbwytio ar ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol.

Jessica serves as the **Area Manager for Wales** at Victim Support, where she oversees critical victim services across Wales, including four Multi-Crime contracts, a Pan-Wales Hate Crime contract, an Anti-Social Behaviour contract, and a Specialist Stalking contract. With extensive experience in managing support services, Jessica previously led the Wales Hate Support Centre and the Rainbow Bridge project, qualifying as an Independent Domestic Violence Adviser, supporting LGBTQ+ survivors of Domestic Abuse.

An advocate for inclusion and justice, Jessica has also volunteered with Stonewall Cymru on their Information Service and volunteered with South Wales Police within the Corporate Support department. Additionally, she has supported young people transitioning from care as a dedicated Mentor.

Committed to staff development, Jessica holds a Level 5 ILM qualification in Coaching and Mentoring and actively coaches team members, fostering growth within the organisation. She earned her Upper Second-Class Honours degree in Criminology from Cardiff University, where she collaborated with the university's Police Science Institute on her dissertation focused on anti-social behaviour.

Egwyddorion Ymarfer Seiliedig ar Dystiolaeth
Principles of Evidence Based Practice: Volume Crime to Serious
Organised Crime

Cafodd **Alex Murray OBE** ei fagu fel plentyn yn y fyddin a graddiodd o Brifysgol Birmingham yn 1996. Mae wedi gwasanaethu mewn rolau CID ac mewn lifrai ar draws Birmingham, Coventry a Wolverhampton ac mae wedi bod yn uwch swyddog ymchwilio gyda phrofiad ym maes Gwrthderfysgaeth a deallusrwydd. Gan ddal meistr o Gaergrawnt (2008) ar gyfreithlonded ym heddlu mewn cymunedau Mwslimiaidd, mae wedi bod yn arfau tanio arbenigol, trefn gyhoeddus, a rheolwr Gwrthderfysgaeth.

Arweiniodd ymchwiliadau trosheddu, fforensig a chudd-wybodaeth fel Troseddau ACC Dros Dro yng Ngorllewin Canolbarth Lloegr cyn dod yn Gomander, Troseddau Arbenigol yn y Met, goruchwyliau seiberdroseddu, masnachu mewn pobl, trosheddu economaidd, a throsheddu cyfundrefnol. Yn 2021/22, arweiniodd ymateb Llundain i lofruddiaethau cynyddol yn eu harddegau.

Mae Alex wedi gwasanaethu fel Prif Gwnstabl Dros Dro Heddlu Gorllewin Mersia ac mae bellach yn Gyfarwyddwr Bygythiadau yn yr Asiantaeth Troseddu Cenedlaethol. Ef hefyd yw arweinydd Plismona'r DU ar gyfer deallusrwydd artiffisial.

Alex Murray OBE grew up as an army child and graduated from Birmingham University in 1996. He has served in CID and uniformed roles across Birmingham, Coventry, and Wolverhampton and has been a senior investigating officer with experience in Counter Terrorism and intelligence.

Holding a master's from Cambridge (2008) on police legitimacy in Muslim communities, he has been a specialist firearms, public order, and Counter Terrorism commander. He led crime investigations, forensics, and intelligence as Temporary ACC Crime in West Midlands before becoming Commander, Specialist Crime in the Met, overseeing cybercrime, human trafficking, economic crime, and organised crime. In 2021/22, he led London's response to rising teenage homicides.

Alex has served as Temporary Chief Constable of West Mercia Police and is now Director of Threats at the National Crime Agency. He is also the UK Policing lead for artificial intelligence. Founder of the Society of Evidence-Based Policing, he introduced randomised control trials to policing, fostering global collaborations. He has trained police forces in India, Cambodia, and Europe and was awarded an OBE in 2017.

Saving lives with GPS

John Porter

Ymunodd John â **Heddlu De Swydd Efrog** fel cwnstabl gwirfoddol yn 1997 cyn dod yn swyddog cyflogedig yn 2000, gan wasanaethu yn Doncaster. Yn **Gydlynnydd Chwilio'r Heddlu** cymwys, mae'n cyngori ynghylch chwiliadau gweithredol ac achosion unigolion coll perygl uwch.

Mae wedi gweithio ar ddigwyddiadau mawr, gan gynnwys y bomio yn Llundain ac achos April Jones. Y mae hefyd yn oruchwylydd gweithio'n uchel ac yn swyddog twysigion.

Gyda diddordeb cryf mewn cefnogi pobl â dementia, dechreuodd John ymchwilio i olrhain system leoli fyd-eang yn 2015 er mwyn gwella diogelwch. Ar ôl i'w dad gael ei ddiagnosio yn 2018, canolbwytiodd ar ddatblygu datrysiaid ymarferol. Yn 2020, lansiodd dreial olrhain system leoli fyd-eang llwyddiannus ar gyfer pobl â dementia, gan alluogi pobl i fonitro eu hanwyliad. Derbyniodd y prosiect sylw cenedlaethol, ac arweiniodd at gydweithrediadau gyda Choleg Prifysgol Llundain i ddatblygu technoleg olrhain a ysgogir gan ddeallusrwydd artiffisial.

Tu allan i'r heddlu, mae John yn hyfforddwr sifiliaidd gyda Chadetiaid Awyr y Llu Awyr Brenhinol, gan wasanaethu fel swyddog hyfforddi Sgwadron ac arwain cadetiaid ar orymdeithiau ffordd 80 cilomedr.

John Porter

John joined **South Yorkshire Police** as a special constable in 1997 before becoming a regular officer in 2000, serving in Doncaster. A qualified **Police Search Co-ordinator**, he advises on operational searches and high-risk missing person cases.

He has worked on major incidents, including the London bombings and the April Jones case. He is also a qualified at-height supervisor and VIP escort officer.

With a strong interest in supporting people with dementia, John began researching GPS tracking in 2015 to improve safety. After his father was diagnosed in 2018, he focused on developing a practical solution. In 2020, he launched a successful GPS tracking trial for people with dementia, allowing people to monitor their loved ones. The project gained national attention and led to collaborations with University College London to develop AI-driven tracking technology.

Outside the police, John is a civilian instructor with the RAF Air Cadets, serving as Squadron training officer and leading cadets on 80km road marches.

Mae **Andrew** wedi bod gyda Heddlu Durham ers 25 mlynedd ac mae wedi gweithio mewn sawl maes plismona sy'n cynnwys: Gwisg, CID, Rheoli Troseddwyr a Diogelu.

Roedd Andrew yn rhan annated o ddatblygu a gweithredu'r Rhaglen Checkpoint, model erlyn gohiriedig ar gyfer delio â throseddwyr yn hytrach na sancsiynau cyfiawnder troseddol traddodiadol. Cefnogodd hefyd ddatblygiad HART (Offeryn Risg Asesu Niwed), model AI i brysbennu troseddwyr i'r Gwaredu. Mae Andrew wedi myfyrio ar y dull EPB hwn ac mae wedi sylweddoli ei bod yn anodd gweithredu, cynnal a chadw a gwnaed camgymeriadau, ond roedd yn gyfle gwych ar gyfer dysgu ychwanegol, nid yw wedi ei atal rhag rhedeg RCT arall!

Yn ystod y cyfnod 2019-2020 cwblhaodd MSt ym Mhrifysgol Caergrawnt mewn Troseddeg Gymhwysol a Rheoli'r Heddlu, archwiliodd ei draethawd ymchwil ddull erlyn gohiriedig o ymdrin â throseddwyr cam-drin domestig gan ddefnyddio technegau ystadegol.

Yn ddiweddgar, daliodd Andrew yr awenau yn heddlu Durham ar gyfer EBP ac Arloesi, mae wedi creu Partneriaeth Ymchwil Ranbarthol (RRP), gyda sawl prifysgol leol i gefnogi a datblygu arfer sy'n seiliedig ar dystiolaeth ym maes plismona.

Andrew has been with Durham Police for the 25 years and has worked in many areas of policing which include: Uniform, CID, Offender Management and Safeguarding.

Andrew was an integral part in the development and implementation of the Checkpoint Programme, a deferred prosecution model for dealing with offenders as opposed to traditional criminal justice sanctions. He also supported the development of HART (Harm Assessment Risk Tool), an AI model to triage offenders into the Disposal. Andrew has reflected on this EPB approach and has realised that RCT's are difficult to implement, maintain, and mistakes were made, but it was a great opportunity for additional learning, it hasn't stopping him from running another RCT!

During the 2019-2020 period he completed a MSt at Cambridge University in Applied Criminology and Police Management, his thesis examined a deferred prosecution approach to dealing with domestic abuse offenders using statistical techniques.

Andrew recently held the lead in Durham police for EBP and Innovation, he has created a Regional Research Partnership (RRP), with several local university to support and develop evidence-based practice in policing.


